A play for two or more actors from Roustabout Theatre Home Delivery

This play is written for you to practise and put on at home.

You could perform it for the people in your household, or why not try filming it on a video call to others in your family, or friends!

There are ideas and hints to help you. The only rule is to HAVE FUN!











Did you know?

This play is based on a fable told all across the **Indian** subcontinent. It is first found in a collection of **Buddhist** writings over 2,500 years old!

The Characters

All the characters in this play are called **WISE ONES**. You can have **as many actors** as you want playing the **WISE ONES**. No one plays the Elephant. Instead the actors **mime** what they are touching.

Costumes

What would someone who believes that they are wise wear? Perhaps you could look at images of famous wise people to get some ideas. They could be real wise people, like Mahatma Ghandi, or fictional ones, like Yoda.

Props

You don't need any props to put on this play.

How to Put on the Play

Sometimes the **WISE ONES** speak together. This is called speaking as a **CHORUS**. It's quite tricky to speak as a Chorus, so make sure to practise this carefully.

When the WISE ONES speak individually, it is up to you to decide who says what line!











Some Suggestions!

Practise your mime skills by holding or touching real objects. Remember what the objects feel like, what shape they are, and how heavy they are. You could turn this into the guessing game 'What's In The Box?' You can see a video of us playing this game here: https://youtu.be/VsXglxwbUTQ

Checklist.

You are ready to go! Here is the script. Let's play!













Here you will find what you need to say! Read the words in black.





THE WISE ONES talk to the audience together as a CHORUS.

THE WISE ONES We are the Wise Ones. There is nothing that we don't know.

A WISE ONE I used to think that I was the wisest.

A WISE ONE Although actually it was me.

A WISE ONE No, it was me.

A WISE ONE No, I was the wisest.

A WISE ONE Then we learned that none of us was the wisest.

A WISE ONE Our wisdom comes from thinking together.

A WISE ONE One day a strange creature was brought to the palace where we all lived.

It was kept in a large room.











A WISE ONE The room was very dark, and so we couldn't see the creature.

A WISE ONE We all went into the room, reached out with our hands, and described what we could feel.

Each of THE WISE ONES closes their eyes and reaches out with their hands.

A WISE ONE [Miming, feeling the elephant's trunk.] I can feel a long, thick, wriggly shape, like a

hose.

This creature is a snake.

Ha! I am the wisest.

A WISE ONE [Feeling the elephant's tail.] I don't think so.

I can feel a short, thin, wriggly shape, with hairs on the end.

This isn't a snake. It isn't even a creature. It's a paintbrush. Definitely.

A WISE ONE [Feeling the elephant's ears.] Are you sure?

I can feel a large, folded, flappy shape, wafting me with a cool breeze.

This isn't a paintbrush. It's a fan. No, wait, two fans. And I know that I am right.











[Feeling the elephant's side.] I know that you are wrong. A WISE ONE

I can feel a massive, smooth, flat surface, larger than I can touch in one go.

This isn't two fans. It's a wall. For certain.

[Feeling the elephant's tusks.] How can you be so certain? **A WISE ONE**

I can feel a long, smooth, pointed shape, that's so sharp at the end.

This isn't a wall. It's a spear. No, wait, two spears.

I hope that there aren't any soldiers holding those spears!

[Feeling the elephant's legs.] There can't be, because I can feel one... two... **A WISE ONE**

three... four thick round shapes, solid and wrinkled like bark.

This isn't a creature. It's a clump of trees.

THE WISE ONES speak to the audience together as a CHORUS.

THE WISE ONES A snake? A paintbrush? Two fans? A wall? Two spears? A clump of trees? Which was it?









A WISE ONE The strange creature was led out into the light.

A WISE ONE And then we saw what it was.

A WISE ONE We were all right.

A WISE ONE But we were also all wrong.

A WISE ONE Have you guessed what the strange creature was?

A WISE ONE It was an elephant!

A WISE ONE And that was how we learned that none of us was the wisest.

THE WISE ONES speak to the audience together as a **CHORUS**.

THE WISE ONES Our wisdom comes from thinking together.
